Poster Presentation Guidelines

Structure of the Poster

The poster should include the following sections:

- Title (It is recommended to keep the title of the poster the same as in the Camera-Ready Copy submitted)
- Authors and Affiliations
- Introduction / Background
- Objectives
- Methods
- Results and Discussion
- Conclusion
- References

General Guidelines

The poster should be a clear visual presentation of your submitted abstract and should meet the following criteria:

- Only the presented abstracts will be included in the final version of the abstract book. The abstracts accepted but not presented will be removed from the final version of the abstract proceedings of UNI-IN ALLIANCE 2026.
- Poster dimensions must be **4 feet (48 inches) in height and 3 feet (36 inches) in width**.
- Slide orientation must be **portrait**.
- **Printing of posters is required.** Posters will be displayed at the designated location on the symposium day during the assigned period.
- Posters must remain on display during their respective sessions.
- Presenters should be available during their allocated session to engage with the audience and answer questions.
- Each presenter should email a soft copy of the poster prepared according to the given template.
- It is mandatory to submit the poster presentation on or before **30th June 2026** to your respective session coordinators via WhatsApp. WhatsApp contact numbers for submission will be communicated to you shortly.
- Text and presentation content should be in **ENGLISH** only.
- The author's name and affiliations should appear after the title (see the attached template).
- Any acceptable font can be used; however, it's best to select a clear typeface with substantial inner space. (Font suggestions: - Verdana, Helvetica) Maintain consistency in font style and size throughout the poster.
- Use concise bullet points instead of long sentences.

- A word count of about 300 to 800 words is most effective.
- Abbreviations must be explained in full at least once in the poster.
- Ensure a balanced layout of text and visuals to make the poster visually appealing and engaging.
- Design the poster so that it is read from **top to bottom** and **left to right**, following a logical flow.
- Use explanatory visuals instead of lengthy text wherever possible.
- Illustrations, charts, and graphs are key elements and should be clear, colorful, and easy to read.
- Tables and charts must be well-structured, correctly labeled, and easy to interpret.
- Properly cite all images sourced externally.
- Avoid odd color combinations, distracting patterns or watermarks that reduce readability.
